Hello everyone,
I hope you are well. It has been a long, long time between newsletters. All my fault!!

But there can be no more procrastination. We are 18 months away from Netherby2016 and from here it is all about planning and locking it in.

In November, 2013 (more than a year ago) I attended a training course on grant applications and how to write a winning grant application.

It was very interesting and it gave me the answers I had been seeking. Over the last few meetings and newsletters I posed the question of whether we should become an incorporated group? I can answer that question now and unfortunately, it is **not** possible for us to incorporate.

As a result we are now fully dependant on relevant authorities/organisations of King Island to do this work on our behalf.

The main issue we need to address is **HOW MANY OF US ARE PLANNING TO ATTEND KING ISLAND FOR THE 150th COMMEMORATION?**

I understand we are still 18 months away— but I am sure the majority of my readers have an idea as to whether you will be planning to attend. So, can I have a show of hands please??? A reply with a yes, no or maybe would be great thank you.

Through out all of my newsletters I have prompted people to have a look at www.netherby.homestead.com This is the website of Karina, a descendant of the Massingham family. Not only is this a fantastic website full of Netherby information but it is has become (a work in progress) your main content of what is planned for Netherby2016.

Karina and I are working together to make this a one stop connection as there are many descendants out there who do not know about me and my newsletter—so if they google search anything Netherby—hopefully it will connect to Karina's site.

If you have not been to the website recently, go back and have another look and don't be afraid to chat with others who might be online at the same time and certainly post your comments and queries!

We will only get one chance at Netherby2016. No matter who you are or where you are—Netherby2016 is for ALL of us. We need comments on the agenda. If you think we need to include or remove any aspect of it – you must let us know. Once we lock the agenda in—there can be only a minimal amount of change.

I also want to hear from you as to your plans if you are NOT going to King Island. Will you still celebrate something big or small locally with your family. This is a very important aspect of the celebrations as we realise not everyone can/will go to King Island.

However, if we can synchronise events on the mainland, in all states, it may be a great selling point for the grants that we will need to run the main event on King Island. Or you could contact your local genealogy/historical society and they may apply for grants so that you can run something local but on a bigger scale.

If we could stream events on King Island via a computer link—would you tune into it?? I don't know how any of this works and I know there will be a cost but if it is something you would support then we will look into it.

This newsletter goes out to over 100 people— closer to 200, so I expect to have my Inbox overloaded with responses. :)

There is no news from our last meeting which was over a year ago. Attendance was a grand total of 4 people. I felt sorry for John who kindly arranged to come in and open the building for us. We are incredibly lucky to have had the venue. However, I am wondering if we will need it in the future and as such have not scheduled any meetings. Again, what are your thoughts?

I am more than happy to have future meetings but they need to be supported. This doesn't always mean you have to attend but communicating your wants/needs is something we can discuss at the meetings. It is about Netherby descendants—so I will be guided by your suggestions.

These are the thoughts presented to King Island Historical Society as an agenda. I have published (on other pages) the minutes of the Netherby Reunion Committee . We need to coordinate ourselves and in the future this page will detail what is locked in or soon to be locked in!!!

Initial thoughts are that Netherby 2016 will be a **4—5 day celebration**.

The 150th anniversary will occur just after 7pm on **Thursday evening** beachside with a light supper afterwards.

Friday would be a free day to explore and hopefully for KI to show off some of it's produces/wares and features.

Friday night—potentially the Netherby 2016 Ball. **This is now a Bush Dance.**

Saturday—a big day, with much happening (something for everyone?).

A football game (item 4.1), golf competition or social game, potentially lawn balls if enough interest? An Orienteering race/challenge (item 4.11)

Saturday evening—free (suspect there may be a big gathering of Skerman families)

Sunday morning—speeches/service again beachside followed by a presentation by the descendants of the Netherby passengers/crew to King Island of trees/plants which will revegetate an area near the Netherby shipwreck site (to be confirmed).

Guinness Book of Records attempt (largest number of descendants gathered for a shipwreck celebration) Item 4.13.

Luncheon (similar to the Long Table) (item 4.12).

End of event.

Running in the background throughout the event:

4.2 **Market stalls**—seasonal produce, art, craft, static displays showcasing KI.

4.7 **Crayfish** (will they be in season?) Tours of harbour area, crayboats, tastings, sales etc

4.8 **Shop window dressings**. Period costumes. Street flags/colour. Something at the airport to welcome our Netherby descendants and something on the round about in Currie central

4.4 **Model boats**. A single effort was made by myself a long time ago to get some boat modelling clubs on-board to set up displays. There was no enthusiasm from the Vic group. A couple of people (in our Netherby group) are interested in building a model of the Netherby. This too is proving a difficult task as there are no known pictures of her. I also thought about bigger boats such as the wooden ship festival?? Maybe we could tie in there somehow?

King Island Historical Society has indicated that they are following up the idea of a model replica of the Netherby.

4.6 **Naval involvement** such as a sail past or rescue demonstrations. Perhaps some sort of tie in with Williamstown? A static display at the least.

4.11 An **orienteering race** that tracks close to the path our people would have taken from Netherby cove to the Cape Wickham lighthouse. **This may become a walk! We have a coordinator on King Island who has made the suggestion.**

4.14 **Museum Display**. All things Netherby. Maybe artist's collections related to shipwrecks in general in a different part of the museum or elsewhere on the island.

Tours of **Cape Wickham Lighthouse?**

4.15 **Genealogy/Ancstral display**. There are a number of annual events world wide. Maybe we could coordinate a display at the market day or at the museum/gallery.

4.19 **Dairy**—as per 4.7 & 4.12—it would be great for the Dairy to be involved in our celebration and an opportunity to show off their produce. Perhaps there are other businesses who need to be included/approached.

4.21 4.22 Two new items will be tabled. Neither is confirmed as yet. I shall hold you in suspense until I have permission to announce.

- School to design a Netherby Flag for the weekend. Historical Society have been working with the school and the Swan Reach School, regarding the Netherby Bell and they were interested in following the Netherby reunion with the Historical Society. The historical Society now need to approach the new headmaster and see if this is still the case and perhaps have reps from 5/6 attend the meetings so the classes can be part of the celebrations preparations, bringing their ideas from the children's perspective.
- Price getting a flag produced, if designed for the weekend (Heidi had a flag priced for the Bronzewing) it would have been \$300 to \$400.
- Possible. Having tokens made, Need to get a quote if we go ahead.....
- Invitations for officials and descendants. Using the original design of the Netherby ticket for passengers in 1866. Cost of publication and design update.....
- Having a dive video made of the wreck site for viewing over the weekend, if we agree, who do we ask..... someone responsible for this project..... This could be setup as a drive in display on the wall of the lens building?
- Do we look at recognizing the birth of Netherby Victoria Louis Cubbins? If so how and who to be responsible for organization.....
- Need someone to be responsible for sending all meeting minutes and newsletters etc to Ann Rutte who can send them out to all known descendants, this can be the Historical Society if needed.....
- Placemats and coaster Netherby designs, someone to look into

NETHERBY MEETING
held in the Tea Rooms at the Museum
Tuesday 13th January 2015 at 9.30am.

Sue began the meeting by reading out a letter which she had received from Ann Rutte.

The meeting continued with discussions on various aspects about the proposed celebrations for the 150th wreck of the ship Netherby.

Finance.

There is \$6000.00 available from Mike Nash for the King Island Historical Society to use to celebrate this event. It is not for raising money, but to be put towards something more tangible.

A suggestion was made that the \$6000.00 could go to an underwater video.

It was suggested that King Island Council be asked for \$5000.00 for project management for this year and be asked for more funds next year to stage the event.

When the Netherby Bell was loaned to the museum several years ago, the students from the local school and from the Swan Reach School all became involved in helping with the celebrations. Andrew Kenyon from Swan Reach hopes this cooperation will continue. Sue will speak to the new principal when school resumes. Ian Allen would also like to involve the students, probably on a walk.

Beanies. The artists from the Cultural Centre and the CWA ladies may be interested in knitting some.

Netherby Flag. Ricci suggested we try to discover where the name Netherby originated. There may be a Coat of Arms. This could help designing a Netherby flag.

Tokens. These have been successful at other historic occasions.

Design on invitations. \$500.00 has been allocated. Using the design of the original Netherby boat ticket.

Articles could be written outlining what will happen at the weekend celebration, but written as a news story, not as an advertisement. These could go in airline magazines.

Celebrating Nettie's birth. A few suggestions were made, and maybe a christening cup.

Currie to Wickham walk. Ricci Bishop is planning on doing this walk in July this year. This will be a practise walk along the beach, and she will be talking about it as she goes. Will put photos and text into a blog which could be linked to the KITI website.

Sue has approached the Dramatic Society about doing a 5 – 10 minute ghost skit at the venues where dinner will be available. The Society are very receptive to this idea.

There will be a marquee in the grounds of the museum with tables and chairs. Tea and coffee will be available and will be for descendants and locals to meet up and discuss what life must have been like on a winters King Island day. Ricci also mentioned Netherby biscuits.
