We talked our way through a coffee or 2 whilst discussing many things Netherby related. It was a very exciting meeting for I knew that Marshall Webster would have played a part in the delivery of the baby born on King Island, who was later christened Netherby Victoria Louisa Cubbin (my great, great aunt) . Speaking of great — it was a great Sunday morning, destined to be repeated. Thank you Christine.
